

# Faculty Fellowship (AY 2024-25) Call for Proposals

The Howard University & PNC National Center for Entrepreneurship is excited to announce the call for proposals for the 2024-2025 Faculty Fellowship Program. We are seeking innovative and impactful research projects that address critical challenges, explore new frontiers, and that advance knowledge and scholarship related to Black entrepreneurship. This fellowship specifically supports HBCU faculty of any discipline to conduct research, produce books, monographs, peer-reviewed articles, e-books, digital materials, and other content in this area of study. Fellows are given a \$10,000 award as a support to their participation and are also asked to present at the Center's annual conference in 2024 and 2025.

Fellows are selected on a regional basis, with each regional center of the National Center for Entrepreneurship awarding at least two Faculty Fellows. The regional structure of the Center is as follows:

<u>Mid-Atlantic Region (Headquartered at Howard University)</u> HBCU Institutions in: Delaware, District of Columbia, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia

<u>Mid-South Region (Headquartered at Morgan State University)</u> HBCU Institutions in: Kentucky, Maryland, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee

Southeast Region (Headquartered at Clark Atlanta University) HBCU Institutions in: Alabama, Florida, Georgia, US Virgin Islands

Southwest Region (Headquartered at Texas Southern University) HBCU Institutions in: Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Oklahoma, Texas



# **Fellowship Project**

This fellowship requests proposals from faculty of any discipline at Historically Black Colleges & Universities. The impact of the proposed research project should specifically advance scholarship and knowledge relevant to Black entrepreneurship. Projects may be at any stage of development.

Projects that could be proposed include, but are not limited to:

- Research which provides insight into the issues, challenges, and barriers facing Black entrepreneurs
- Research which highlights best practices for advancing opportunity for Black entrepreneurs
- Research which studies ecosystem building for Black entrepreneurs
- Case studies, books, article series, and/or multimedia content which feature Black entrepreneurs as protagonists
- Research which investigates entrepreneurship education at HBCUs and considers best practices
- Research which considers the financing and funding of Black-owned businesses

# **Guidelines for Application Submission**

The following should be prepared as a part of the fellowship application:

- A. A project proposal not exceeding four typed double-spaced pages detailing the scope of work for the research project
- **B.** A recent CV/resume



# **Proposal Structure**

The proposal (limited to four pages) shall contain three main sections as set forth below.

- A. Introduction
  - i. Statement of the problem and research question(s) to be addressed
  - ii. Major objectives of the research project
  - iii. Significance of the project in relation to the current state of knowledge.
- B. Research Design and Methodology
  - i. Research methodology, including hypotheses to be tested (if applicable)
  - ii. Data and sources, collection, and analysis
- C. Timeline of project activities and expected date of completion of project

#### **Evaluation and Selection**

Proposals will undergo a rigorous evaluation process by an expert panel, and selection will be based on the significance of the research, methodology, feasibility, and potential impact. Results will be communicated to applicants following the evaluation process.
